Any included document should clearly support your position as to why the Utah County Commission should consider overturning the sale of the property listed on the front page of this protest.

UTAH COUNTY STATEMENT ON DATA PRIVACY

When a government agency requests an individual to provide personal data, the Utah Government Data Privacy Act, as found in Utah Code Title 63A, Chapter 19, requires the agency to inform the individual of the purpose for the data collection, the manner in which the data will be used, and the potential consequences of withholding the requested information. All personal data provided will be protected and maintained as confidential to the extent required by law for the program or service for which the information is submitted.

The Office of the Utah County Auditor requires the completion of these forms to evaluate your eligibility—or the eligibility of the organization you represent—to file a protest of a property sold on the May Tax Sale. Any personal data provided will be used solely to the extent necessary to review and determine the validity of the protest submitted to Utah County. Although submission of the requested information is voluntary, failure to provide it may result in delays or denial of the protest. All data collected is maintained in accordance with the applicable record series and as required by Utah Code 63G-2-307.
